ACTIVE BILLS THAT SUPPORT CHOICE

SF76 / HF353 AND SF1452 / HF1590

The Parent's Bill of Rights seeks to unify and restore basic parental rights.

SF512 / HF666 AND SF2579 / HF2799

No Patient Left Alone Act seeks to establish the right for a patient or resident to choose to have support person present while receiving care or services.

SF204/HF1226

Seeks to prohibit vaccination requirements by the government or businesses in Minnesota.

HF682

Seeks to amend the Minnesota constitution to establish the right of a parent to direct the education of their child.

SF811 / HF1953

Seeks to establish that higher education conscientious exemptions apply to institutional policy mandates.

ACTIVE BILLS THAT OPPOSE CHOICE

HF367/SF610

Seeks to repeal the existing conscientious exemption for vaccinations in childcare settings and allow daycare centers to adopt policies refusing service.

BILLS STOPPED IN THE 2023 SESSION

In the unprecedented flurry of bills filed and passed in the 2023 session, Minnesota families won a hard earned victory:

Homeschool testing privacy was maintained.

BILLS PASSED IN THE 2023 SESSION

Unfortunately, significant ground was also lost for informed consent and parental rights:

- Legalized abortion to full term, no informed consent, parental consent or notifications. Sanctuary state status established.
- Education standards adopted to mandate critical race theory and gender ideology in public schools.
- Require schools participating in PSEO to remove faith statements for admissions.
- Sanctuary state status established for medical gender transitions for minors.
- Amended current statute allowing courts to remove custody of children denied access to gender transition services.
- REMOVED language in the Minnesota Himan Rights Act that stipulated minor attraction is NOT a sexual orientation.
